CONGRESSWOMAN GIFFORDS' VISIT WITH THE USPP



On August 5th, Congresswoman Giffords visited the Upper San Pedro Partnership to share good news regarding the federal funding of Partnership projects in Federal Fiscal Year 2010. Thanks to the support of Congresswoman Giffords, the U.S. House of Representatives recommended that \$600,000 be appropriated for the Bureau of Reclamation Feasibility Study. Also, the House recommended that \$254,000 be included in the base of the Agricultural Appropriations bill for the USDA, Agricultural Research Service, Southwest Watershed Research Center. Including this funding in the base of the bill, will preclude the need to request the funding on an annual basis as an "earmark".

Holly Richter, Executive Committee Chair, briefed Congresswoman Giffords on the status of Partnership projects and challenges facing the Partnership. The Congresswoman and Partnership members exchanged ideas for maintaing the Partnership's momentum.

Peter Gierlach of Spadefoot Nursery, aka Petey Mesquitey, was the guest speaker at a Water Wise sponsored presentation on the use of native plants in outdoor land-scaping. Petey Mesquitey demonstrated how the use of these drought-resistant, low water use plants are anything but boring. This event was organized by Water Wise and was open to the public free of charge.











COMMITTEES & WORK GROUPS

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee identified possible funding sources for at least part of the Feasibility Study local match. The Bureau of Reclamation prepared a draft Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) and the City of Sierra Vista proposed to prepare a draft IGA-type agreement for review at the next meeting. Fort Huachuca introduced the committee to a potential water conservation project in Sonora, Mexico that could yield 400 to 500 acre feet of water savings annually. This project could provide significant hydrological benefits to the Sierra Vista subwatershed.
